This website, begun in 2001, shares the experience of some of the many SA members who deal with same sex lust and have found in SA a safe place to recover.

Sexaholics Anonymous (SA) is one of several Twelve Step fellowships dealing with recovery from self-destructive sexual thinking and behavior. While other fellowships may make no distinction between same-sex and opposite-sex behavior, SA explicitly defines sexual sobriety to exclude same-sex behavior.

This unique aspect of SA sobriety has actually drawn many members dealing with same-sex issues to SA. Surveys of SA members show that something like one in 5 SA members have experienced same sex lust.

Some of us joined SA from other S fellowships because when we stated we wanted to stop all same-sex behavior we were greeted with lack of support or even derision.

Many of us have been in same-sex relationships, while others have never acted out with another person, and still others have had countless sexual partners. Some of us follow traditional religious practice, others do not. Some have been secretive about having same-sex attractions, while others may still live with a former sexual partner. Regardless of these circumstances all of us have discovered in SA sobriety the "key to a happy and joyous freedom we could otherwise never know." (*Sexaholics Anonymous p202*)

Perhaps there are few members in your SA group or area dealing with same-sex lust. This resource is for those recovering from same-sex lust and those wanting to learn more about same-sex lust recovery in SA.
